History of I AM's Temple Ministries

1983

We began our ministry in Plainfield in 1983. Our ministry started with just a few people and the meetings were held in the Pastor's home for several months in Plainfield. New Jersey. The vision was growing and we started a "Word of Faith Bible School" via satellite. We did street evangelism, nursing homes, ministry to the homeless, and to battered and abused woman and children. 1985

We needed a larger place for ministry, and the Lord gave us the opportunity to purchase the St. Stephen Episcopal Church, located at 620 Ravine Rd. in Plainfield. Soon after purchasing this property, we started our children's ministry with Sis. Cole and 7 children from 2 1/2 through Kindergarten. After several years, our ministry grew to over our capacity, which was 105 children with a waiting list.

1999-2000

We were inspired to fill the need and began to look for another facility, to not only accommodate our waiting list, but to include up to the 8th grade. We rented space at 815 West 7th Street in a building owned by the Temple Sholom. The Lord opened the door for us, and we undertook the blessing with great enthusiasm. We started with over 200 children covering pre-school through 8th Grade for 5 years, and we are looking forward to building upon the vision the Lord has given us.

2001-2002

Isabel Montes, a Pastor from Plainfield, joined with us, and was led to start a Spanish Ministry. Her congregation has now grown to around 200 people. Our ministry in Plainfield has expanded over the passed 20 years. Our children have become productive citizens of our city, and we are exited about continuing our legacy to the citizens of Plainfield and to the neighboring cities.

2003

We are looking forward to the future of Plainfield, and we are ready to lead our church and congregation into the new Millennium. We have many plans such as a Bible School, a Bible book store, and a recording studio, just to name a few. We have the Lord Jesus as our guide, and with hard work by the Pastor's and leaders, we can accomplish mighty things. We are looking forward to a great challenge ahead.

2004-2005

Our Mission Statement

We are committed to train boys and girls to know Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior, and to teach them through the word of God to have a strong foundation spiritually and academically.

Our Philosophy

We are a Kingdom building school, we are led by the call of God, His son Jesus and the Holy Spirit, which leads and guides us as we administer a Christ-centered, biblically directed education.

Our Purpose

We are here to help grasp our children out of the hands of the enemy, and allow them to grow in the wisdom and stature of Jesus Christ; and to build equality in relationships, helping to develop Christ-like qualities, unity in the spirit, and advancing the cause of Christ. Together, we stand firm in one spirit, one mind, striving together for the faith of the gospel (Phil. 1:27).

Our children receive exposure to the truth of the gospel and are given the opportunity to receive Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.

Our teachers will train our students in the ways of God, teach our students in the word of God, and build relationships in love. They will also help our students receive a spiritual and academic foundation, producing Christians who will make a difference, challenge our students to grow in the knowledge of God, and will be examples showing them, through their character and leadership, how to serve others.

Admission Requirements

1. Application

a. A completed application with a non-refundable registration fee of \$75 per family will be due upon registration, renewable each school year in September.

2. Tuition

a. Tuition is \$120.00 a week per child, if you have two children, it is \$110.00 a week per child, if you have three or more children tuition will be \$100.00 a week per child. Tuition is due every Monday of every week, from the first day of school in September through the last day of school in June, *including Christmas week*, vacations, holidays, and absences.

(Please note our annual tuition is \$5040 per year, which has been broken down by the week for your convenience)

3. Birth Certificate

a. All students are required to submit a copy of their birth certificate upon enrolling.

4. Immunization Record

a. All students are required by the State of New Jersey to present a copy of their updated immunization record upon enrolling.

5. A Child Medical Record Form

a. Form attached to your application or on our website should be signed by a doctor.

6. Transcripts

a. Completed transcripts including report cards, progress reports, and standardized test scores from the previous year, must be submitted for students in grades K5 -12th grade.

7. Parent Contract

a. All parents must sign a written document stating that they have received the parent/student handbook, agree to pay all fees in a timely manner, and will cooperate with all school rules.

Discrimination Policy

I Am's Temple Christian Academy admits students of any race, color, nationality, or ethnic origin in all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, nationality or ethnic origin in administration of its educational policies, admission policies, scholarships, loan programs, athletics and other school administered programs.

Academics

We use "A Beka Book" curriculum for 2-1/2 through 5th grade as well as "Ignitia Online School" curriculum, for 6th through 12th grade. These curriculums contain a day-to-day lesson plan that is written for Christian schools and is based on a Christian education. They include all main subjects for every grade level.

Curriculum

- A. 2 ¹/₂ thru K-3 Bible, Phonics, Numbers and Writing.
- B. K-4 all the above- including beginner Reading
- C. Kindergarten through 2nd grade

a. Reading, Phonics, Math, Writing, Language, Spelling, Science, Health, Social Studies, Art, Poetry, Praise & Worship, Bible, Physical Education, Spanish, Computers and Drama and Leadership.

D. 3rd through 8th Grade

a. Reading, Writing, Language, Mathematics, Science and Health, History and Geography, Bible, Praise & Worship, Spanish, Physical Education, Art, Computers and Drama.

9th through 12th Grades – Ignitia Online School

School Supplies

Book Prices

Each child is required to pay the book fee listed below for his/her particular grade. The fees for each grade are as follows:

It is very important that the book fees are paid by September 28, 2012. This is to ensure that the student will begin the lessons prepared with his/her class. **This does not apply to Ignitia Students

ACCOUNTING POLICY

<u>Payments are due on the first school day (Monday) of each week.</u> Payments <u>must be brought to the office by a parent or an adult.</u> Please do not send your <u>payment in your child's backpack or lunchbox</u>. Payment in full is due every week including holidays, vacations, and absences. Our accounting policy is set upon a weekly system. If you would like to setup your payment plan on a bi-weekly or monthly basis, you must arrange your payment schedule prior to the opening of school and pay in advance. All fees must be kept current and paid in advance.

Payment is expected each week. <u>If payment is not received the school will</u> <u>notify you promptly.</u> Your child will be sent to the office and not allowed to enter class until we hear from their parent.

Any child attending our before/aftercare program is expected to pay a \$10.00 fee for before/care and a \$25.00 fee for after/care per week in addition to their tuition fee. Transcripts and report cards will not be released unless we have received payment in full this includes before care and aftercare fees.

REGISTRATION FEE

<u>The non-refundable registration fee is \$75.00 per family</u>. Registration fees are due along with the application and are renewable on a yearly basis.

If you have more than one (1) child at the Academy you are only required to pay one (1) fee for all registrants in the same family.

TUITION FEE

Our tuition fee is \$120.00 per week for each child enrolled at school. If you have two children the fee will be \$110.00 per week for each child. If you have three or more children enrolled at I.A.T.C.A. the fee will be \$100.00 per week for each child.

The \$35.00 Before care/Aftercare payment is added to the tuition payment and is due the first day of each week in advance along with your tuition and if not received your child will not participate in the aftercare program and you will have to pick up your child at 4:00 p.m. Payments are due in full every week from September through June, including Christmas week, all vacations, winter recess, holidays, and absences. <u>All payments must be kept current and must be paid in full before transcripts</u> can be released.

If you pay by check, and we receive a returned check by your bank for NSF, you will be charged a \$35.00 returned check fee, and that payment will be required in cash. If we receive three (3) returned checks at any time during the school year, all future payments must be paid in cash.

Before care

Our school has setup a before care/aftercare program. <u>Before care</u> is before school and begins at **7:00 AM and requires a \$10.00 weekly fee for this service.** All parents must sign their child in at the door. If a parent brings a child any time before **8:00AM**, they will be considered as part of this program.

<u>Aftercare</u>

Our <u>Aftercare</u> Program begins at **4:00 PM and ends at 6:00 PM**. If a child is picked up anytime between **4:00 PM and 6:00 PM** they are considered as part of this program and will be charged **\$25.00 per week/\$5.00 per day**. When your child is picked up any time after **6:00 PM**, they will be charged a **\$10 late fee**, which will be given directly to the after care teacher on that day-**NO EXCEPTIONS.** It is a very long day. Please be considerate of your child(ren) and our staff.(**Please refer to the Aftercare Policy and Procedures**)

Drop off Procedures

<u>School begins at 8:00 AM sharp!</u> Parents who bring their children before 8:00 AM must walk their child into the building, sign them in, and bring them to the before care room. Children arriving at 8:00 AM must be brought to the chapel.

Dismissal Procedures for 2¹/₂ yr. olds through 8th Graders

<u>School dismissal is 4:00 PM</u>. <u>When a student is not picked up by 4:00 PM</u> <u>he/she will be brought to the aftercare room to wait. If this happens, the parent</u> will be charged the aftercare fee (\$5 per day).

Tardiness

All students are expected to be in school on time which is at 8:00am. Our day begins with chapel and prayer. This is a very important part of our day. It is mandatory that all students participate in chapel.

Absences

If a student is absent from school, the parent must call the school with the student's name, grade, and the reason for the absence. If the student is absent for three (3) or more days, they must have a doctor's note when they return to school. Students are required to make up all missed class work and homework.

School Closing for Inclement Weather

After 6 a.m. you may contact the school voicemail at (908) 753-6222 or access our website: www.iamstemple.org for updates concerning inclement weather. We will follow the same inclement weather schedule as the PLAINFIELD BOARD OF EDUCATION. In case of an emergency closing, you will receive an e-mail and/or text as well as the voicemail mentioned above. (Please be sure to keep your e-mail information current.)

Classroom Guidelines

Each teacher will publicly display a written copy of classroom rules and guidelines. We expect each student to follow these rules.

(K-5 to 12th grades only) <u>Detention</u>

Detention will be given when a students does not follow the classroom guidelines, does not respect the property of the school, or disrespects director, administrator, teacher, or any adult. **Physical or verbal violence will not be tolerated.** When a student receives one detention, a letter will be sent home to inform the parent of the reason and when the detention will be served. **This letter must be signed and returned to the office.** If not served, the student will receive another detention along with the original one. When a student receives a second detention, there will be a parent/student conference with the director and the student's teacher. **Three detentions for any reason will result in a one-day suspension from school.**

Suspension

<u>As well as receiving three (3) detentions, severe or violent behavior such as</u> <u>fighting, vandalism, theft or any foul language that suggests any sexual content</u> <u>will result in automatic suspension</u>. When a child is suspended, he/she must be picked up immediately (there will be no in-school suspension) and a letter of explanation is sent home with the child, and he/she will receive a"0" for the days work. <u>If a student is suspended three times, it will result in expulsion</u>. We <u>will</u> enforce our policies. In the past, we have been extremely lenient (Mercies of God). *This year we will follow our handbook*. We expect full cooperation of students and their parents.

Report Cards

Report Cards are given at the end of each marking period, which lasts approximately ten weeks. They are given to communicate to parents the progress of their child. Attendance, tardiness and conduct are also recorded. <u>Report Cards will be included as part of your child's permanent files.</u> Report card distribution dates: 1^{st} marking period-Nov. 21^{st} , $2012 - 2^{nd}$ marking period-Feb. 8^{th} , $2013 - 3^{rd}$ marking period April 19^{th} , 2013 and 4^{th} and final marking period-June 20^{th} , 2013.

Progress Reports

Progress Reports will be administered during the 5^{th} week of each marking period. Every student from $K5 - 12^{th}$ grade will receive one. If the teacher feels a conference with the parent is needed they will be marked accordingly. Progress Reports are used to keep the parents informed of their child's progress and level of understanding.

Grading System

The grading system will be different for kindergarten than it will be for 1^{st} to 12^{th} grade. The grading system is as follows:

Homework Policy

Each student is required to complete his/her homework assignments.

Between 3:00pm and 4:00pm is homework time in the classroom. During this time the students have the teacher's assistance. All assignments must be signed by a parent and returned the next day. This will ensure that the parent is informed of what their child is learning, and whether or not they completed their assignments.

<u>Homework is 33% of the students grade in each subject. It is very</u> important that all homework is completed, signed and turned in the very <u>next school day.</u>

Standardized Testing

<u>Stanford 10 Achievement Tests (SAT's)</u> are given yearly to all students in grades K5 and above during the last week of April. The tests cover major subjects and test students to check their progress. A copy of the results can be picked up in the office approximately 4-6 weeks after the tests are administered if not it will be placed in the envelope with their final report card. <u>There is a \$30 fee</u> to cover these expenses.

Dress Code

- 1. Uniforms, including belts, are required everyday (no exceptions). If your child is not in uniform, he/she will be sent to the office and you the parent will be notified to either bring the correct uniform or pick him/her up from school. This is a strict mandate of the school and will be followed accordingly.
 - a. $2^{\frac{1}{2}} 8^{\text{th}}$ Grade Boys

Navy blue pants, belts, and white or navy collared shirt, navy blue sweater or sweater vest and black shoes or black, navy or white sneakers only.

b. 2^{1/2-}8th Grade Girls

Navy blue jumper, skirt, skort, or slacks with a belt and white or navy collared shirt. Black shoes or black, navy or white sneakers only. White, navy or black socks or tights ONLY. (no multi colored socks or tights.)

c. 9^{th-}12th Grade Boys

Khaki pants, belts and white, light blue or navy collared shirts, <u>with school emblem.</u> Black shoes or black, navy or white sneakers only.

d. 9^{th-}12th Grade Girls

Khaki jumper, skirt, skort, or slacks with a belt and white, light blue or navy collared shirt <u>with school emblem</u>. Black shoes or black, navy or white sneakers only.White, navy or black socks or tights ONLY. (no multi colored socks or tights.)

Same colors for Gym day t-shirts, shorts or sweatpants.

Students are not allowed to dress down unless you have received a written letter from the school advising to do so.

CELL PHONES

<u>Cell phones are not allowed in school.</u> If they are found in class they will be confiscated and you (the parent/guardian) will have to come to school to pick them up. You may call the office anytime if you need to speak to your child.

LOST AND FOUND

Each student must properly identify his or her belongings, with their name clearly printed on lunch boxes, and clothing items. <u>I.A.T.C.A will not be responsible for any</u> student's belongings. They must be clearly marked for proper identification. All identifiable items found will be brought to the child's teacher or placed in the lost and found bin. It is the responsibility of the parent to make sure that each item is marked.

BIRTHDAYS

When celebrating your child's birthday in school, you may bring a cake, cupcakes, pizza or any food items. Please give the teacher advance notice, so he/she can prepare his/her schedule for the celebration.

FIELD TRIPS

Field trips will be taken periodically throughout the school year, but they will vary according to each grade level. Parents will be notified in advance with details including cost if there is any. Signed permission slips along with emergency phone numbers will be necessary. **Parents will also be asked to chaperone.** If you wish to do so, please notify us on the permission slip.

PARENT/TEACHER CONFERENCES

All parent conferences are by appointment only, other than the ones scheduled by your child's teacher. <u>Teachers are not able to be interrupted during class instruction time.</u> If you must speak with your child's teacher, appointments can be made Monday through Friday 9am-4pm with the office staff.

LUNCH/SNACKS

All students are required to bring their own lunch/snacks to school. Please make sure they are properly identified. <u>We encourage children to eat healthy lunches and snacks.</u> Please bring plenty of drinks and provide enough food for your child, especially for those who remain in the aftercare program. <u>Please do not send candy or gum to school with your child.</u> <u>Your child will not be able to order lunch at all.</u> REMEMBER, time is limited, only preheated meals. All utensils, plates, napkins, etc. are necessary.

BEDDING

Any child under 5 years of age (ages 2 ¹/₂ through k4) is required to take a nap every day. Please bring a child size sleeping bag or blanket with a small pillow as well as a change of clothes in case your child has an accident.

Uniform Blessing

All parents that have uniforms that their child has outgrown, such as jumpers, skirts, blouses, sweaters, slacks, etc., and are in good condition, will have the opportunity to bring them into the office and donate them to our "Uniform Blessing" program. All parents that may have a need for uniforms can check with the office.
